Global Partners understands doing well on the TOEFL test is a big step towards unlocking many educational and professional opportunities. Our TOEFL Preparation Program is dedicated to successfully navigating the TOEFL test and getting an improved score. The objective of the course is to prepare student reading, writing, listening, and speech skills to a level where they can confidently take the exam at their optimal level.

As TOEFL iBT curriculum is considerably difficult our teachers gauge student interest and address the need for outside ESL curriculum and activities in order to get the most out of the study experience. A balance between the rigorous program and a schedule that includes some different material and activities helps the students focus on success but also helps to maintain the interest and energy needed to be successful when test taking.

During the course the students participate in for practice TOEFL iBT exams. Each student receives a current edition of the Official Guide to the TOEFL iBT with CD-ROM with four Practice Exams. Students also receive our Global Partners Curriculum which has been developed over the last 15 years and is revised annually to provide the best guide to taking the TOEFL test. As the "I" in iBT stands for "internet" we provide students with in class laptops. To alleviate pre-exam jitters we also tour a TOEFL iBT testing centre so that students can actually see the testing environment and gain helpful tips for exam day preparation. During the program we conduct a tour of a local library to highlight ESL/TOEFL iBT/conversational group resources so the students are aware of local study opportunities. To test student verbal presentation skills, we also participate in a local public cultural presentation activity. Field trips are built into the curriculum with pre and post follow up activities and presentations in class. Our teachers are chosen for their expertise of the TOEFL iBT and solid English as a Second Language teaching skills as well as their familiarity in working with other cultures. Many of our teachers have extensively taught English abroad.



Most Canadian colleges and universities require a TOEFL score of 80 (iBT internet based test) or 550 (PBT paper based test) in order to successfully submit an international application.
